Captain C. Stribling SNODGRASS, Jr. graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy, class of 1949, and served successively in USS SIBONEY (CVE-112), USS F.D. ROOSEVELT (CVA-42), and USS LSMR 405 during his first four years of commissioned service. His next assignment was with Commander Amphibious Group FOUR as Flag Lieutenant. In 1955 he reported to the Commander in Chief, U.S. Naval Forces, Eastern Atlantic and Mediterranean in London for duty in the Operations Division. He then served in USS R. H. MCCARD (DD-822) for two years prior to reporting to the U.S. Fleet Anti-Air Warfare Training Center, Dam Neck, Virginia for instructor duties. Returning to sea in 1962 he commanded USS DETECTOR (MSO-429) for two and one half years. He attended the Armed Forces

Staff College in 1965 prior to his assignment in the Antisubmarine Warfare and Ocean Surveillance Division in the office of the Chief of Naval Operations. He assumed command of USS CORRY (DD-817) in early 1968 and served therein until reporting to Commander Destroyer Division TWO TWO TWO.

Captain SNODGRASS holds the Bronze Star Medal, World War II Victory Medal, Navy Occupation Service Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, and the Vietnam Campaign Medal.

Captain SNODGRASS and his wife, the former Eleanor Lee Potts of Shepherdstown, West Virginia, reside in Virginia Beach, Virginia with their children Susan (19), Geoffrey (16), Richard (14), Llewellyn (10), and Julia (8).
