CAPTAIN RALPH DI CORI

Captain DI CORI was born in Watertown, Massachusetts. He graduated from Watertown Massachusetts High School in 1939 and Massachusetts Nautical School in 1941. Upon completion of school he served in the Merchant Marine as Third and Second Officer until April 1943. He joined the Navy in April of 1943 and has had continuous active service since he served in the Pacific during WW II and in USS JUNEAU (CLAA-119) and in USS HENRY W. TUCKER (DDR-875) during the Korean War.
